



## *Aftercare Instructions: Eyeliner*

For the first 48 hours, you will have some discomfort, some slight swelling and possibly bruising. If bruising does occur, you can use concealer to cover it. You may also take any over-the-counter pain medicine. Place a cold towel (not excessively cold - no ice) over your eyes to reduce the swelling. Do not apply any ointment. The day after your procedure, you may wear eye shadow, mascara, etc. but be careful to avoid your eyeliner. It will build a scab and you **MUST NOT** peel it off or you risk losing color. The scab will fall off naturally on its own.

### *General Aftercare:*

- You can wash your face like normal, but blot your eyes dry. **DO NOT RUB.**
- Sleeping slightly elevated helps to reduce swelling.
- To prevent infection, keep your eyeliner clean by using a Q-tip to carefully remove make-up.
- Wearing glasses/sunglasses outdoors will help to protect your eyeliner from dust, the sun, etc.
- Wash your hands before touching your eyeliner.
- Some itching is normal. **DO NOT PICK, PEEL OR SCRATCH** your eyeliner or your color may heal unevenly and you risk scarring and infection.
- Do not expose your healing skin to direct sunlight or tanning beds.

### *Touch-up Procedure Information:*

If you would like to make any changes to your permanent makeup, please call to schedule an appointment two months after your original procedure. Touch-ups are \$25 each, if done within a six month time frame from the original procedure. After six months, the price is adjusted based on evaluation.
